FBI Employee Sentenced 46 Months for Possessing Child Pornography

ALEXANDRIA, Va. – Samuel I. Kaplan, 65, of Gainesville, Va., was sentenced today to 46 months in prison, followed by 15 years of supervised release, for possessing child pornography.

Neil H. MacBride, United States Attorney for the Eastern District of Virginia, and Glenn Fine, Inspector General for the U.S. Department of Justice, made the announcement after sentencing by United States District Judge T.S. Ellis, III.

Kaplan pled guilty to possessing child pornography on June 3, 2010. According to court records, Kaplan, who was employed as an Information Technology Program Manager at an FBI facility in Chantilly, Va., was discovered using the FBI's network to facilitate sexually explicit communications. During the course of investigating Kaplan, investigators from the Justice Department's Office of the Inspector General discovered that he possessed, on his home computer, between 10 and 20 images depicting minor victims engaged in sexually explicit conduct.

This case is being investigated by the United States Department of Justice Office of the Inspector General. Special Assistant United States Attorney Jeffrey Zeeman is prosecuting the case on behalf of the United States.

This case was brought as part of Project Safe Childhood, a nationwide initiative to combat the growing epidemic of child sexual exploitation and abuse launched in May 2006 by the Department of Justice. Led by United States Attorneys' Offices and the Criminal Division's Child Exploitation and Obscenity Section (CEOS), Project Safe Childhood marshals federal, state and local resources to better locate, apprehend and prosecute individuals who exploit children via the internet, as well as to identify and rescue victims.
