DOJ OIG Releases Flash Report on the Status of Department of Justice CARES Act Funding as of June 12, 2020 and Other CARES Act Reporting Requirements

Department of Justice (DOJ) Inspector General Michael E. Horowitz announced today the release of a flash report providing the status of DOJ funding received from the U.S. Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES Act) and other DOJ CARES Act reporting requirements.

This flash report gives a snapshot of the status of the \$1.007 billion in CARES Act funding received by DOJ components. It also lists upcoming due dates related to reporting requirements outlined in the CARES Act and subsequent Office of Management and Budget (OMB) guidance, as well as the initial initiatives the DOJ Office of the Inspector General (OIG) has taken to ensure robust oversight of this critical funding.

The DOJ OIG notes that the figures included in this flash report are unaudited and based solely on data received by the DOJ. We intend to make periodic updates to this flash report as additional information becomes available.
