## **Applicable Laws and Policies**

The AG Memo titled "Prohibition on the Solicitation of Prostitution," dated April 10, 2015 ("the AG Memo Prohibiting Prostitution"), states that all Department personnel, including attorneys and law enforcement officers, are prohibited from soliciting, procuring, or accepting commercial sex at all times, whether on or off-duty or on personal leave, and regardless of whether the activity is legal or tolerated in a particular jurisdiction, foreign or domestic. The AG Memo Prohibiting Prostitution further states that supervisors and managers are subject to discipline for failing to report suspected violations. "Suspected violations by Department employees must be immediately reported to the internal affairs personnel of the relevant component's headquarters.... Allegations determined to be non-frivolous also must be reported to the component's security personnel."

According to 18 U.S.C. § 1001, it is unlawful to, "in any matter within the jurisdiction of the executive . . . branch of the Government of the United States, knowingly and willfully . . . make any materially false, fictitious, or fraudulent statement or representation."

FBI Offense Code 2.5, Lack of Candor/Lying – No Oath, states that an employee is in violation for knowingly providing false information when making a verbal or written statement, not under oath, to a supervisor, another Bureau employee in an authoritative position, or another governmental agency, when the employee is questioned about his conduct or the conduct of another person. "False information" is defined to include false statements, misrepresentations, the failure to be fully forthright, or the concealment or omission of a material fact/information.

FBI Offense Code 2.6, Lack of Candor/Lying – Under Oath, states that an employee is in violation for knowingly providing false information in a verbal or written statement made under oath.

FBI Offense Code 2.11, Obstruction of an Administrative Matter, states that an employee is in violation for taking any action to influence, intimidate, impede or otherwise obstruct an administrative matter.

FBI Offense Code 4.6, Indecent/Lascivious Acts, states that an employee shall not inappropriately act in a manner to appeal to or gratify the sexual desires of the employee, his victim, or both.

FBI Offense Code 5.7, Failure to Report – Administrative, states that an employee is in violation for failing to report to the appropriate FBI official or supervisor, in a timely manner, about an administrative matter which the employee knew, or should have known, was required by FBI or DOJ regulation or policy to be reported.

FBI Offense Code 5.8, Failure to Report – Criminal/Serious, states that an employee is in violation for, among other things, failing to report to the appropriate FBI official or supervisor, in a timely manner, any serious misconduct or criminal conduct committed by another employee of which the employee was aware.

FBI Offense Code 5.23, Violation of Miscellaneous Rules/Regulations, states that an employee is in violation for failing to enforce or comply with an FBI, DOJ, Office of Personnel Management, or other federal administrative or operational guideline or policy not specifically delineated in any Offense Code.

FBI Policy Directive 0535D – Unofficial Contacts and Reporting Requirements, states that all FBI personnel must report unofficial contacts with foreign nationals. FBI personnel must report these contacts through the Enterprise Process Automation System (EPAS) using the FD-981 (Report of Foreign Contact) or FD-1078 (Personnel Self Reporting Requirements) form. This Directive requires FBI employees to report suspicious, unusual, or unexpected contacts involving individuals engaged in or associated with criminal or terrorist activities within 72 hours, and all other unofficial contacts with foreign nationals within five business days. Unofficial contacts are defined as "ongoing, close, personal, intimate, or familial relationships or voluntary associations and friendships." According to

this Directive, unofficial contacts do not typically include "routine commercial transactions for goods or services or unavoidable ad hoc or casual encounters, such as in restaurant or retail shops, during community or sporting events, or through sporadic purchases or contacts via the Internet." In addition, "[c]asual contacts or associations arising from living in a community or while attending a house of religious worship do not normally need to be reported to the FBI."

FBI Policy Directive 0796D – Reporting FBI Employee Misconduct, states that FBI employees are expected to adhere to, and maintain high standards of, professional and ethical conduct in both their professional and private lives. FBI employees are obligated to report misconduct when they: (1) personally witness misconduct, (2) become aware of misconduct committed by another FBI employee and have reason to believe it has not yet been reported, or (3) commit misconduct themselves. An FBI employee who makes a good-faith disclosure of information that may evidence misconduct committed by another FBI employee will not be subjected to any adverse action based on the disclosure.
