

Transcript: “Careers at the OIG: Auditor” June 2017

My name is Natasha Torres, I am an Auditor with the Atlanta Regional Audit Office. I’ve been there for six years now. Prior to becoming part of the OIG, I worked in Puerto Rico in a CPA firm for about a year and a half. And I did want to do something different because in addition to deter waste, fraud, and abuse, I like to see that things are in compliance, I like to know that what we do is important, and just something different from what I was used to seeing. So that drew my interest. After about five years of being an Auditor in Atlanta, I was looking for leadership opportunities to grow professionally and personally.
